Doggy toys

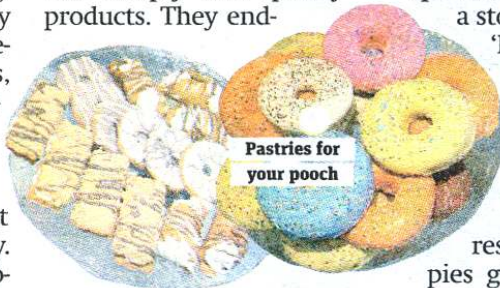
- ◆ Boston pet store also serves as a place for grooming and for daycare

**B**ark Place owner Kathi Malloy calls her pet store “a dog spa and boutique,” but this canine emporium-plus is as much about health and education as it is a pom-pom cut or a squeaky chew toy. In January, Malloy launches a free Saturday series, Healthy Hounds, which focuses on educating two-legged animals on adopting a healthier lifestyle for their pets.

“We’re passionate about what we do,” says Malloy. “We’re all-natural, with a fo-

cus on organic products. If they’re better for us, then they’re better for our dogs, too, right?”

Bark Place opened in 2009 and Malloy originally intended on running a store that simply sold quality products. They end-

ed up with a store, a DIY dog wash and grooming facility and two rooms for doggie daycare — or play-care — divided by size and temperament.

“When we found this space, it was far too big for a store, so we thought, ‘Let’s use it for daycare!’ The spa is a self-wash area and we have a professional groomer, too.”

gifts, Malloy says this education series is timely.

“The problem is that Christmas is the busiest and most stressful time for most people. Adding a poor puppy to that is just madness. There are too many hazards, and the puppy doesn’t get the attention it needs.”
